- Compliant with Court Ruling
- This map contains less county splits than the base map
- Keeps Orlando, Kissimmee, and Tampa wholly represented
- Only 2 Districts crossing Dade – Broward Line
- Does NOT double cross a single county (anti-carving rule)
- Other than District 20, Only splits 8 cities: Tallahassee (to attain 42% required BVAP), Miami (satisfy minority requirement), Pembroke Pines (satisfy minority requirement), Miramar (satisfy minority requirement), Clearwater (Population Equality), Apopka (Population Equality), Fanning Spring (sits on county border), and Jacksonville (Population Equality)
- In District 20, Broward and Palm Beach must be split to meet the >50% rule
- District 2 is east – west with 42.8% BVAP as required
- District 13 & 14 do not cross Tampa Bay
- District 21 & 22 are more compact than base map
- Homestead & Hendry County are not split (Everglades Represented)
- 27 total compliant congressional districts with no precinct boundaries crossed!
